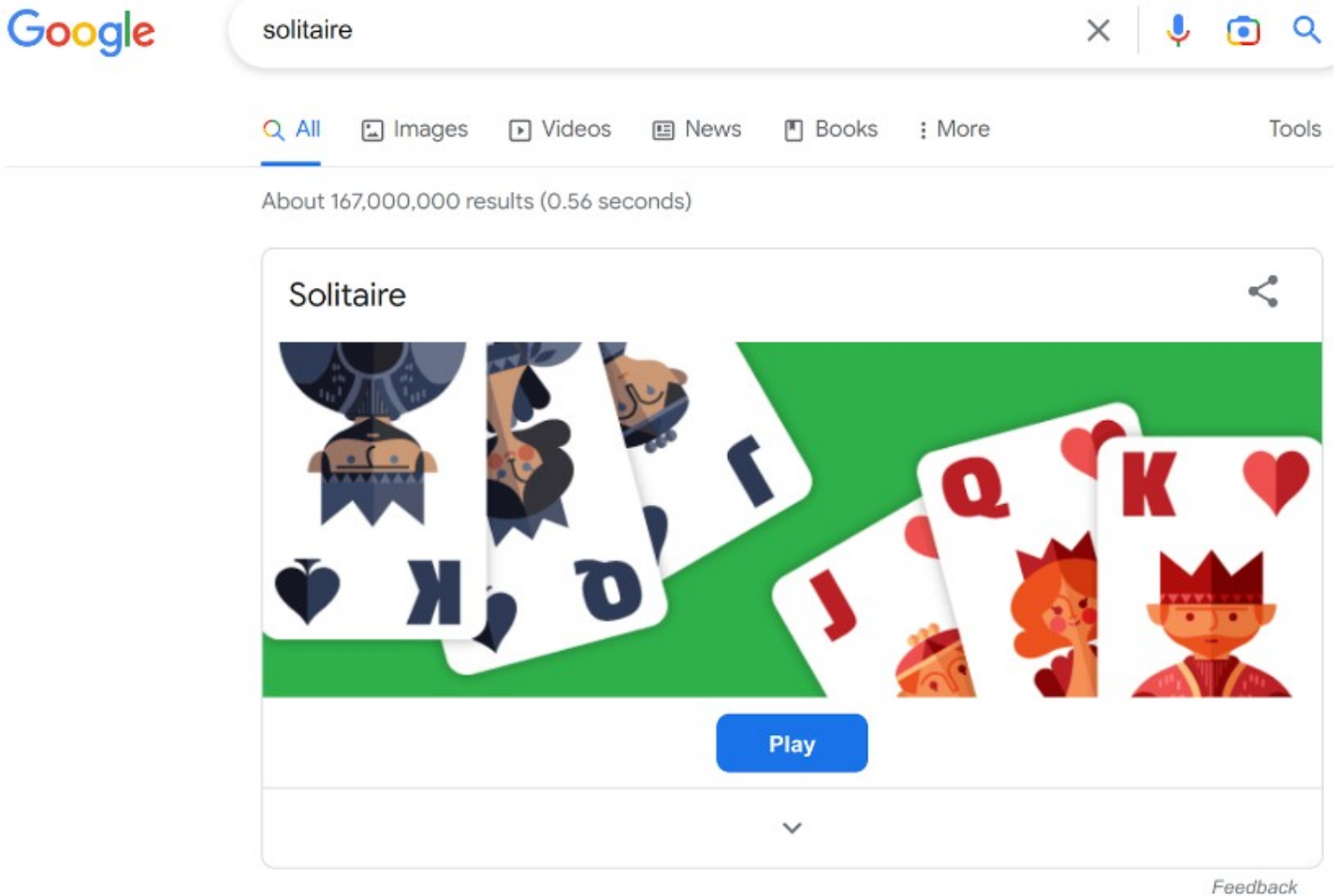


# Using Google






Then we get a little more serious, but not much, and click on Tools
